YOUTH AND PAWS

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

NEIGHBORHOOD ADVOCATES

In 2024, we anticipate a significant expansion of our Neighborhood Advocates (NA) program, driven in part by the recent political shifts at City Hall, including a new mayor, city council members, and BARC shelter director.



Our goal remains to empower residents with information and resources to actively address animal welfare concerns in their communities, which often requires working with elected officials and other city entities.

NA's inaugural event for 2024, "What's next for city, county, and state animal welfare?", will bring together area shelter leaders, including the new BARC director. This hybrid event (online and in-person) promises engaging discussions and a strong attendance.



FIXIT SPAY NEUTER PROGRAM

Through our Fixlt program, we spayed or neutered 567 dogs and cats free of charge in 2023. We also partnered with East End Kitties to fix an additional 285 cats.



Out of necessity, we began working more with our long-term private vet provider, which has resulted in improved services but at a higher cost. While we are happy to prioritize quality care, increased vet costs strain our ability to maintain and expand FixIt services in the future without additional funds.

We remain committed to promoting responsible pet ownership by providing free spay neuter services; however, this requires us to always remain mindful of the bottom line and consistently raise funds throughout the year.

2ND ANNUAL TAILS & TRAILS







First on the agenda for our busy October was the 2nd Annual Tails & Trails, a fitness and community walk at Mason Park in the East End. We were blessed with perfect weather, a great turnout, and even a partial solar eclipse! We provided eclipse glasses for everyone to safely witness this rare phenomenon, adding a truly unique element to the event's conclusion. 
EAST END KITTIES

In 2023, Barrio Dogs increased its support for East End Kitties (EEK), a TNR (trap, neuter and return) program led by our board member, Darla Berry. Last year, Darla and her team trapped 285 feral neighborhood cats. With our help, those cats were spayed or neutered, vaccinated and returned to the area where they were trapped.

While EEK and other organizations work tirelessly, managing large populations of feral cats remains a challenge in Houston. With your help, Barrio Dogs will continue to provide vital support to EEK in 2024.
